Risk Statement

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk.

By taking membership of HFSC, each member agrees and acknowledges that:

1. they are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in any organised event or free sailing;
2. they are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
3. they accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
4. their boat is in good order and they are fit to sail;
5. the provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the HFSC does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
6. the provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
7. it is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue and to attend any safety briefings held for events they are participating in;
8. their boat is adequately insured, with cover of at least £1,000,000 against third party claims.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

CLUB RULES SECTION 8

8 Club Duty Obligations

- 8.1 It is a condition of membership that each member carries out two duties per sailing season.
- 8.2 One duty will be a "Sailing" duty, the second duty may be a "Club" duty or an additional Sailing duty as necessary to support the Club's schedule of events and husbandry requirements. The club will try and take members preferences into account when allocating the second duty.
- 8.3 Sailing duties involve supporting a sailing event and are critical to the function of HFSC. This may be either to act as Officer of the Day (managing a race), manning the safety boat or similar. These are published in the race programme at the beginning of the season and listed on the club website.
- 8.4 Club duties can be anything the club determines as important to the running of HFSC, such as simple maintenance, husbandry or cleaning, supporting social events, etc.
- 8.5 In the event that a member is unable to carry out a duty they are required to swap their duty with another member (see rule 8.8) or if practicable (for example if the duty is a husbandry or maintenance task) carry out the duty on an alternative date as close as possible to the original.
- 8.6 New members will NOT be nominated to do any Duties during their first season of Membership.
- 8.7 Any member failing to fulfil duties for which he or she is responsible will become liable to a £50 fine. This shall be paid with the club membership fees for the next season, or before if the member intends to resign from the club before next season's membership fees become due.
- 8.8 Members may swap duties or arrange for a stand-in to carry out their duty providing the substitute is competent to fulfil the role (particularly for duties involving the Safety Boat).
- 8.9 All swaps and stand-ins shall be communicated to the Sailing Secretary who will update the duty roster accordingly.
- 8.10 If a member arranges a stand-in, the member remains responsible for the duty even though someone else is doing it.
- 8.11 If a member arranges a stand-in with somebody who is NOT a Club Member, the stand-in must be agreed with a member of the Committee.
- 8.12 Members may be allocated a training duty. This will involve being trained on using the Safety Boat and/or OOD duty. A training duty is exactly the same as any other duty.
- 8.13 Club members are responsible for arranging swaps or stand-ins; advising the Sailing Secretary that they cannot perform a duty does not take away an individual's responsibility for doing their allocated duty.
- 8.14 If a member does not wish to do an OOD or Safety Boat Duty they may be exempted by notifying the Secretary by the 31st January, with a payment of £50.

Procedure for Premium Bonds Held for HFSC

We currently hold some of the club funds in premium bonds. These have been bought in the Treasurer's name (Jennifer Laws) and the Committee holds a list of the bond numbers and a signed authority that they were bought on behalf of HFSC

The committee agreed the following procedure in the event of any wins on these bonds.

The possible prize values are:

£25, £50, £100, £500, £1,000, £5,000, £10,000, £25,000

£50,000, £100,000

£1 million

A win of up to and including £25,000 will be retained in club funds.

A win of £50,000 or £100,000

- 50% will be retained by the club and 50% distributed to the qualifying club members.

A win of £1 million

- £100,000 will be retained by the club and the balance distributed to the qualifying club members.

Definition of Qualifying Club Member:

To qualify for a share of any winnings a member must be fully paid at the time of the win and has not indicated that they are leaving the club.

However, if a win is received in January or February then a qualifying club member would be one that is:

Fully paid in that year

or Fully paid for the previous year and has not indicated that they intend to leave the club.

Distribution

The winnings would be distributed as follows:

Family membership	3 Shares
Single membership	2 Shares
Crew membership	1 Share
